




Figure 4.3-3. Spike Field, view 1 (concept and art by Michael Brill).






Figure 4.3-8. Menacing Earthworks, view 1 (concept and art by Michael Brill).

Egypt

Perhaps the most famous architectural monuments in the world, the pyramids were built of stone with a rubble core as enlarged and elaborated versions of the humble mudbrick mastaba. The masses of masonry were partly symbolic, partly protective, and seemingly disproportionate for the sepulchral chambers they covered. They were worthy memorials but hardly inviolate. A remarkable ability in surveying, immediately obvious from their sheer bulk and proved by the accuracy of layout and orientation was necessary for their construction. The great pyramid of Cheops differed from the others in its greater bulk and internal layout. It had three separate chambers while the Chephren pyramid had one chamber with two approaches. Mycerinus' tomb had one chamber and one entrance.





Figure 4.4-9. Pyramid of engraved blocks: An example of durable message transmittal.





Figure 5. Pictograph Definition of Symbols—Circle with Slash (art by Jon Lomberg).
